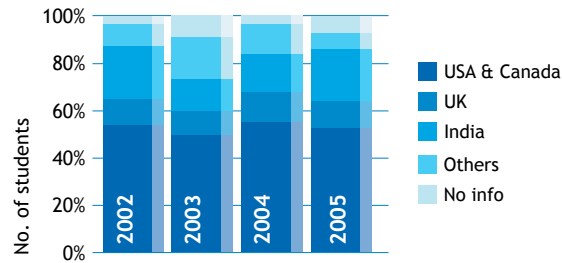

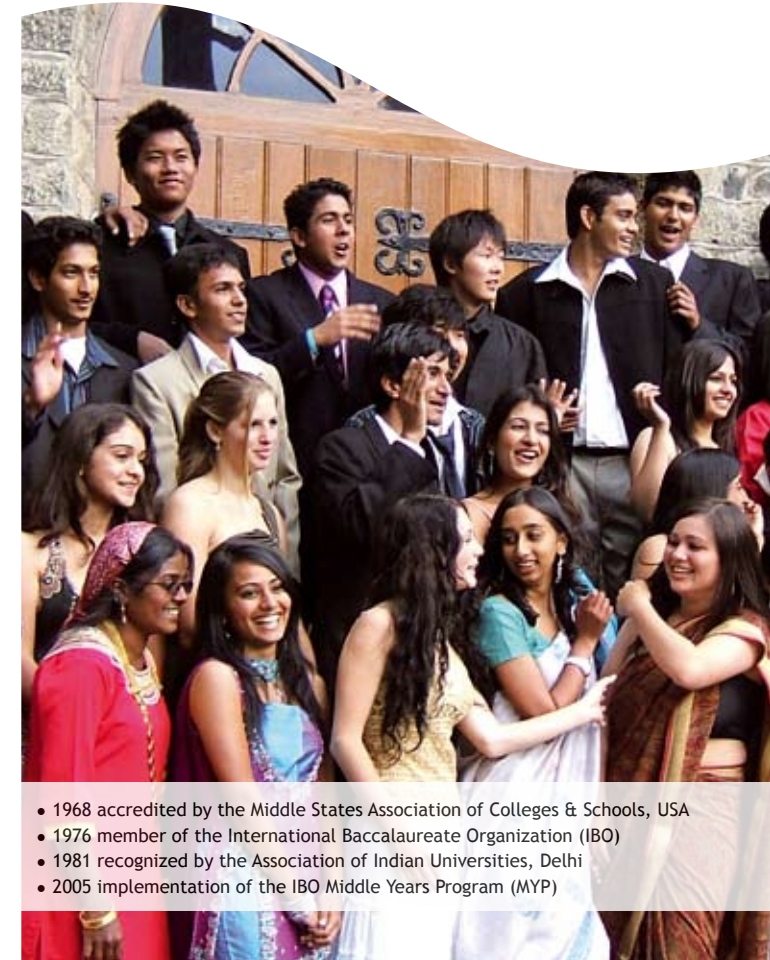

Introduction

Kodaikanal International School (KIS) is an independent coeducational boarding K–12 school located at 7000 feet in the peaceful Palani Hills of South India, a region known for its rugged beauty and cool temperate climate. KIS combines an ambitious academic program and a rich range of extracurricular activities within a Christian values framework that draws on a variety of cultures and prepares students for global citizenship.

KIS offers International Baccalaureate and American curricula to around 500 students in Pre–school through Grades K–12, coordinated in Elementary, Middle and High School programs. Full boarding students are accepted from Grades 4–12. KIS has run a strong outdoor and environmental education program since 1987 and a nearby wilderness campus for its extensive hiking and camping program since 1994.

KIS graduates consistently achieve higher results than world mean scores in IB Diploma and SAT exams. 100% of KIS students who apply to colleges and universities worldwide, gain entry. KIS High School Diploma is accredited by the US Middle States Association of Colleges & Schools and recognized by the Association of Indian Universities Delhi since 1981, allowing KIS students to enter Indian universities directly.

- Established in 1901 as an American boarding school for the children of missionaries in India
- In 1976 KIS became the first IB school in India when it adopted the International Baccalaureate Diploma program and in 2006 was authorized to offer the IB Middle Years Program to Grades 6 –10
- Students and staff from more than 30 nations share in a multicultural residential experience
- Today KIS is recognized as one of India’s most prestigious academic independent schools

KIS philosophy

KIS is an autonomous Christian international boarding school with an academically challenging college–oriented curriculum intentionally set in a communal life based on the life and teachings of Jesus Christ, devoted to service in India and the whole human community.

Faculty

KIS has an international faculty represented by teachers from Australia, Bhutan, Canada, France, Germany, India, Indonesia, Korea, Netherlands, Philippines, New Zealand, South Africa, Spain, Sri Lanka, Switzerland, Tibet, UK and USA. Advanced degrees are held by a majority of the faculty. The overall student to teacher ratio is approximately 7 to 1.

KIS information

The school year is from July to May, and has a minimum instruction period of 36 weeks (180 instructional days) divided in two semesters.

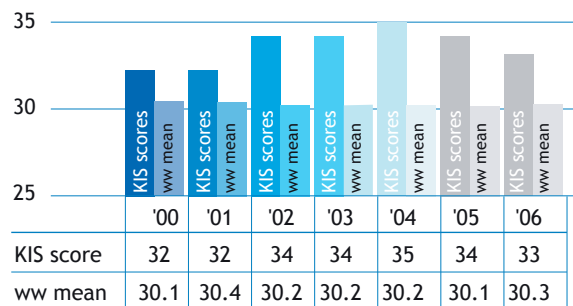

International Baccalaureate (IB)

In addition to the KIS Diploma, students may earn the IB Diploma by passing at least 6 examinations in prescribed subject areas: 3 must be at Higher Level and 3 at Standard Level. Examination papers are set by international experts and marked externally by the International Baccalaureate Organization. Students must also:

- Complete at least 100 hours of instruction in a course entitled Theory of Knowledge
- Complete an extended essay of 4000 words involving independent research in an IB approved subject
- Participate in an approved program of creativity, action and service (CAS) totaling a minimum of 150 hours – 50 hours for each CAS section

IB results comparison - KIS & worldwide (ww)



More than 50% of KIS graduates earn the full IB Diploma each year and the Class of 2006 scored a 99% pass rate. Additionally, over 30% of Grades 11–12 students appear for Higher Level and Standard Level IB Certificate examinations in more than 30 subjects, consistently scoring above the worldwide average. KIS also offers the Middle Years Program (MYP) of the International Baccalaureate Organization (IBO) for Grades 6 – 10.

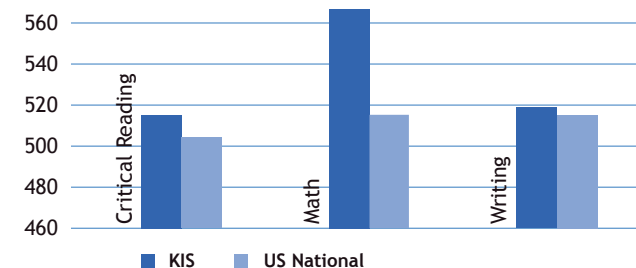
Standardized Test Scores (SAT)

KIS is a testing site for the Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT), American College Testing (ACT) for US college admissions, PSAT (Preliminary Scholastic Application Test) and SSAT (Secondary School Admission Test).

- 2006 – 2007 KIS ACT mean score: 23
- KIS Grade Point Average (GPA) maximum 4.0 unweighted

KIS has recently become a testing center for the Bio Medical Admissions Test (BMAT) and has been the South India testing center for Royal Schools of Music (RSM) since 1980.

KIS High School Diploma

KIS High School graduation is defined in terms of credits leading to the awarding of the KIS Diploma. These credits only apply to subjects taken in Grades 9 to 12. Each course is assigned either 5 or 2.5 credits per semester depending upon how many hours the class meets per cycle. Students are awarded these credits upon successfully passing the course work required. For example, 40 credits required in English means students must take 8 semesters of English over a 4 year period (earning 5 credits per semester or 10 credits per year. 10 credits = 1 Carnegie Unit)

Additionally, students are required to take Physical Education and participate in Social Experience programs for the KIS Diploma. Second Languages currently offered are French, German, Hindi, Spanish, Tamil, Dzongkha and ESL. Indian mark sheets are issued to all Grade 12 students whether they choose to go to Indian universities or not.
